“Do Richer People in China Get Healthier? A Look at Income Disparities and Implications”

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China's rapid growth, economic policies and resulting income inequalities are affecting the physical well-being of its population. Dr. Ling will discuss how changes in the levels of income and changes in income inequalities are affecting the health of China's population--both in adults and children--during this period of economic transition.

Dr. Ling, who received a Ph.D. from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, was a post-doctoral research fellow at the Harvard Medical School and the Harvard School of Public Health in Boston from 2001-2003. Her research interests include mental health, industrial organization, applied econometrics and health economics.
