1992-2004 2006-present	<u>Social Work Practice 1:</u> (SOWK 543); 3 units. 45 hours. This course introduces the student to the basics of generic social work practice with a focus on working with individuals. Students are introduced to the values of the profession, to multicultural social work, and various theories of practice. The primary task of this introductory course is learning to do a Psychosocial Assessment.
2010 – present	This course was converted to the MSW@USC virtual program. Continues to be fine tuned and updated.
1992-2005	<u>Human Behavior and the Social Environment:</u> (SOWK 505); 3 units. 45 hours. This course addresses various theories of personality and development through a multi-systemic lens including group, family, culture, organization, and community theories.
1992-2004 2006-2009	<u>Human Behavior in Mental Health Settings:</u> (SOWK 605); 3 units. 45 hours. This course examines explanatory theories of mental health and illness from a biopsychosocial perspective. As a core required course in the Mental Health concentration it covers the gamut of problems seen most typically in mental health settings.
2011 – present	This course was converted to the MSW@USC virtual program. Continues to be fine tuned and updated.
2000-2005 2007-2009	<u>Social Work Practice in Mental Health Settings:</u> (SOWK 650, 599, 694). 3 units. 45 hours. This is the 2 nd practice course in the Mental Health concentration. An experiential format is utilized to teach student the Yalom model of group psychotherapy, an evidence-based interpersonal model. Other types of groups are also presented to acquaint the student with the range of group therapies within mental health agencies.

2000-2004

Social Work Practice in Mental Health Settings: Part 11. Applications of Object Relations and Self Psychology. (SOWK 650). 15 hours. Although this course is currently taught as a 15 week course on groups, earlier versions consisted of two modules with Part 2 covering a topic of the instructor's choosing. This elective addressed major concepts of these more advanced psychoanalytic theories and how to apply them in working with clients.

Social Work Practice with Clients with Personality Disorders: (SOWK 599). 3 units. 45 hours. This course which I developed in conjunction with Dr. Helen Land covers personality disorders identified in the DSM with an emphasis on Borderline and Narcissistic personality disorders. Explanatory theories of these disorders and their practical applications are presented through both didactic and experiential formats.

Human Sexuality in Clinical Social Work Practice: (SOWK 674). 3 units. 45 hours. Developed and taught this course as an elective for students across concentrations. Designed with a clinical emphasis, it addresses the major sexual issues with which clients present.

Treating Trauma and Post Traumatic Stress in the Military (SOWK 641); 3 units. In conjunction with Dr. Helen Land, developed this course for the new Military Social Work program. Course is an overview of empirically supported treatments for trauma and PTSD and builds on prior practice and behavior courses.
